## Medical Information

### **Check if you or your child has coronavirus symptoms**

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.

**Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.**

**Your child can attend school with a seasonal common cold**

### **Medical appointments**

Please try to make appointments outside of the school day. Where this is not possible, please be aware there maybe a short wait for your child to be brought out to you.

### Medication

Where possible medication should be administered at home. If medicine needs to be given during the school day, please ensure it is put in a named zip locked bag. All medication must have a corresponding form, which can be downloaded from the school website (frequently used forms section) and emailed to the office.

A reminder that we have children with severe nut allergies and nuts, peanut butter, Nutella etc. are not allowed in children's lunch bags.

We know that choosing a school for your family is a complex and important decision. Staff and governors are all very proud of our school but we know that when you choose a school you need to feel confident that your child will be cared for, valued and above all else happy.

During these new and uncertain times, we are not be able to arrange our usual Open Tours.
