



## HENRY CHICHELE PRIMARY - P.E. AND SPORTS GRANT FUNDING 2016 -17

*“Everyone working together for life-long learning”*

The government provides additional ring-fenced funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this, which we are required to report. The effectiveness of our plan is reviewed continually and at the end of every academic year.

In 2016-17 the school was allocated £9000. Our objectives for this year are as follows:

- Kick-start healthy active lifestyles by promoting healthy lifestyles and engaging all pupils in regular physical activity.
- Raise the profile of PE and sport by increased opportunities for participation in competitive sports, both within and beyond the school.
- Continue to develop our teachers’ P.E. teaching skills by providing opportunities for them to teach alongside professional coaches.
- Support pupil premium and other vulnerable children by offering free extra-curricular sports activities.
- Continually review and where possible increase the range and availability of different sports to the children.
- Empower pupils to make lunchtimes more active and fun.
