

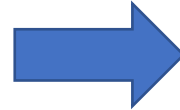
Significance and Legacy- Key Concept thread through History

Year 1

The history of our high street:

Children will investigate what we buy and how we go about our shopping habits which tells us about the sort of people we are and reflects the changing nature of our place. (Term 5)

Year 2

Remembrance:

Children will understand that there are events beyond living memory that are significant locally, nationally and globally. (Term 2)

Year 4

Ancient Greeks:

Children explore the Greek's influence on education, language, architecture, government and the Olympic games. (Term 4)

Curriculum links: **English**- discussion **PSHE**- Rights and responsibilities

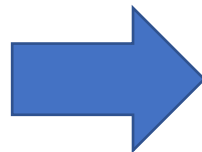


Year 5

Curriculum links: **English**- quest narrative

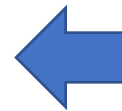


Year 3

Year 6
