




Mrs Scott (phonics lead and Year 1 class teacher) provides hands on workshops from the beginning of the year.



For you at home:


- Practise video links for sounds taught will be sent weekly, via Tapestry.
- Children will initially have a picture book retelling a story and describing a picture.
- As soon as children are able to blend to read words with first 16 sounds taught, they will bring home a Read Write Inc. blending book.
- As children progress through the programme, the reading materials sent home will reflect this.
- Library books selected weekly.

We use the Kinetic Letters programme to provide children with the skills to write accurately and with fluency.



We teach learn stories through re-telling them frequently, using story maps and using actions while we re-tell the text.


#### Innovate

Once we know the text well, the children have the opportunity to change some of the story to make it their own.

#### Independent application

Finally, we have a go at writing/drawing our own ideas independently.

Across the school, we use White Rose Maths to teach all areas of maths.

We use the resources to enhance our provision progressively throughout the year.

In EYES and KS1 we use NCETM's Mastering Number programme to provide children with an opportunity to explore number including the composition of numbers. Children will know a range of counting strategies and will have a secure knowledge of number facts.


### Provision



## Uniform

In Early Years, we love to be active, busy and messy!

## **School lunch**

- All children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 are entitled to 'Universal Free School Meals'.
- Food is provided by our caterers, Love Food.
- You have an online account and you will need to book online in advance.
- You can order a hot or cold lunch.
- You will need to order lunch for your child from and including Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September.
- Your child is welcome to bring a packed lunch from home we ask that this is a healthy lunch but <u>MUST</u> be nut free due to allergies within the school.
- A piece of fruit is available every day for every child to have as a snack in the morning.
